3. The Unboxer (Proceed with Caution)

- **The Play:** Buy keys and open every new case that drops.
- **Why:** Pure home entertainment. Mathematically, opening cases is similar to playing a lotto with a greatly manipulated house edge. While hitting an unusual knife or covert skin yields an enormous dopamine hit (and monetary return), the huge bulk of openings result in low-tier, low-value weapon surfaces.
