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A healthy septic system is a peaceful partner. When it works, you hardly think of it. When it stops working, you think about little else. A backup on a vacation weekend, a soaked patch over the drain field, a whiff of sulfur near the tank lid, these problems carry real expenses and a fair amount of tension. ## How a septic tank really works
