College scholars roll their eyes at flag-themed jerseys. Shop owners ask if a flag in the window will repel a few customers. The item itself has not transformed. The experiences stuck to it have.

The Pledge of Allegiance, first written in 1892 by using a Baptist minister named Francis Bellamy, did not at all times consist of the words less than God.
