2. **The In-Game Store:** Every Thursday, Facepunch releases a curated batch of new skins directly through the primary menu. Once acquired, these skins are tied completely to the gamer's Steam inventory.

The Economics of Rust Skins

What separates Rust from many other survival video games is its completely integrated economy through the Steam Community Market. Gamers can buy, offer, and trade skins freely. For some, skin gathering is a casual hobby; for others, it is a serious financial market comparable to *Counter-Strike* skin trading.
