What Drives Skin Rarity?

Rarity isn't simply about the color of the text in a player's stock. Three primary mechanics dictate how rare-- and important-- a specific weapon surface truly is.

- **Float Values (Wear Rating):** CS2 skins vary from *Factory New* (0.00 to 0.07) to *Battle-Scarred* (0.45 to 1.00). Some skins are "float capped," suggesting they can not drop in Factory New condition, making the lowest possible float for that skin incredibly rare.
- **Pattern Templates:** As seen with the Case Hardened or Fade finishes, the seed number dictates how the texture is mapped onto the 3D design. Certain rare patterns develop aesthetically pleasing or symmetrical designs.
