The internment of Japanese Americans will never be undone by means of a letter of apology and a scholarship fund. For those households, patriotism in the main reads as a settlement in dispute, no longer a valentine. It is not very that patriotism has been replaced by way of cynicism. It is that the be aware fee, as in is patriotism a worth, skill one thing specific whilst the bill of rights felt extra like a bill of exceptions.

The fair answer is that justification traditionally attaches itself to instances and places with sharper edges. During wartime, leaders urge unity, and public symbols transform extra charged.
