What Does a Refrigerant Leak Mean for Your Repair Budget?

A refrigerant recharge for a 2000 square foot system typically runs \$300–\$600, depending on how much refrigerant the system lost and the current market price of R-410A. But here's what homeowners need to ask: where is the leak coming from?

A small leak in a fitting might be sealed and recharged once. A leak in the coil or compressor discharge line means the refrigerant will escape again, and you'll be back to square [same-day hvac unit repair](#) one. How Does a Failed Capacitor Impact Your Total Repair Cost?

The capacitor is a small but critical electrical component that starts your compressor and fan motors. When it fails—usually after 5 to 15 years of use—your system stops cooling or heating, even though the rest of the equipment is fine. A capacitor replacement costs \$150–\$400 and is one of the most straightforward repairs we perform at Sacramento Precision HVAC Repair.

What matters for your budget is recognizing that a failed capacitor is NOT a sign your whole system is failing. Many homeowners fear they need a full replacement when really they just need a new capacitor. If the capacitor failed because of age and normal wear, that's a repair. What to Expect When a Compressor Fails?

A basic 3-ton air conditioner replacement runs toward \$4,000–\$6,000. A full heat pump system with modern controls can reach \$8,000–\$12,000.
