

A roof rarely asks for attention all at once. It usually whispers first. Dark streaks along the shingles. A patch of moss near the north side. Granules collecting in the gutter. A section that stays damp long after the rest of the house has dried. By the time most homeowners notice the problem from the driveway, the roof has often been dealing with it for months, sometimes years.
