- **Esports Betting:** Wagering real money or skins on expert CSGO/CS2 matches (e.g., ESL Pro League, Majors) based on real-time chances.

3. **The Roll/Outcome:** When combined, the server seed, client seed, and a nonce (a counter) produce the outcome.
4. **Confirmation:** After the round concludes, the unhashed server seed is exposed. The gamer can input these variables into a verification tool to make sure your home did not manipulate the roll.
