- **The Steam Community Market:** Players can purchase and sell skins directly through Steam, with transaction costs topped by Valve.

- **Trade-Ups:** Players can trade ten skins of a particular wear tier for one skin of the next greater tier.

Understanding Skin Wear and Rarities

Not all skins are produced equal. The visual quality and market worth of a skin depend heavily on 2 main aspects: **Rarity** and **Wear Condition**.

Weapon Rarities

Rarity determines the baseline drop rate of a skin. Valve utilizes a color-coded tier system to classify products:

Color	Code	Rarity	Tier	Description
Blue	Consumer/ Industrial/ Mil-Spec	The most typical tier. Normally makes up the bulk of random drops and lower-tier case contents.		
Purple	Restricted	Unusual skins with more detailed		

designs. **Pink** Classified Unusual skins that are heavily demanded by collectors. **Red** Covert Exceptionally rare weapons. Many renowned rifle skins fall into this classification. **Gold/ Special** Amazing The rarest tier, exclusively reserved for knives and unusual glove versions.

Wear Conditions (Float Values)

Every skin is appointed a floating-point number between 0.00 and 1.00, known as the **Float Value**. This number identifies how used or scratched the weapon appears.

Wear Condition Drift Value Range Visual Appearance **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Beautiful, perfect finish with very little to no scratches. **Very Little Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Slight blemishes or scratches, generally near the edges. **Field-Tested (FT)** 0.15-- 0.38 Visible wear and tear, however the artwork stays mostly undamaged. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Considerable scratches and dulling of colors. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Greatly used, rusted, or scraped. (Note: Some specific skins look purposefully cool when battle-scarred, earning the nickname "Blackimov").

The Virtual Economy: Why Are Skins So Expensive?

To an outsider, investing hundreds or perhaps thousands of dollars on a digital gun texture appears absurd. Nevertheless, the CS: GO skin economy operates on core financial concepts of supply and demand, deficiency, and utility (social status).



Factors Influencing Skin Prices:

1. **Supply and Demand:** If a case is ceased, the supply of its skins stops growing. As the gamer base broadens, need boosts, driving rates up.
2. **Drift and Pattern Templates:** Some skins feature algorithmic patterns. For example, the *AK-47|Case Hardened* has different amounts of blue coloring depending upon its pattern index. A "Blue Gem" pattern can command astronomical rates.
3. **Expert Play (Esports):** When a professional player uses a specific skin during a major competition, need for that skin frequently spikes overnight.
4. **Sticker labels and Souvenirs:** Applying professional competition sticker labels to a weapon or owning a memento plan from a Major can considerably change its value.

Notable High-Value Sales

- **AWP|Dragon Lore (Factory New, Souvenir):** Signed by professional players, these have actually traded hands for over £ 100,000.

- **StatTrak™ M4A4|Groan:** Due to a copyright issue, this skin was pulled from drop swimming pools early in its life, making it extremely uncommon and valuable.
- **Blue Gem Karambit (Case Hardened - Pattern 388):** Rumored to have been valued at over £ 1.5 million, representing among the most costly digital products in gaming history.
