A careful locksmith will look at the whole door, not just the keyway. That judgment matters because a rekey can solve access concerns, while a replacement solves both access and mechanical failure.

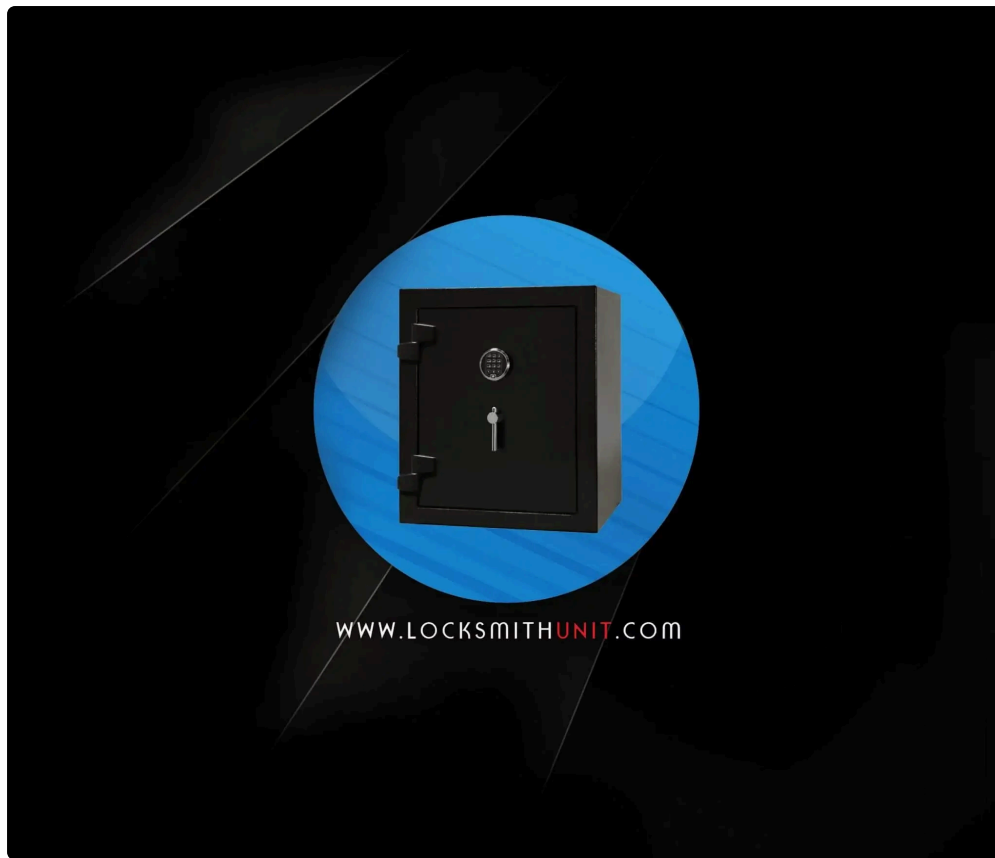
How modern lock choices change a home
