



Garage Door Lock Maintenance Services in Los Angeles

Dirt, objects, or a shifted storage item can interfere with the door's path. Clean the lenses of the garage door sensor and check whether both sensor lights appear correctly aligned. Misaligned garage door sensors may prevent the garage door opener from closing the door.

Door alignment is another common cause. If one side reaches the floor before the other, the tracks, rollers, cables, or spring system may require professional attention. Do not pull or adjust a cable under tension. The manual release can disconnect the door from the garage door opener, but it should only be used carefully and with the door supported. A heavy or unstable door can fall when disconnected.

If the door shuts but the garage door lock will not lock, the locking bars may be bent or the door may not be fully seated. Avoid pressing again and again the garage door remote, since continued operation can increase damage to the opener or door system.

An unusual noise such as scraping, popping, scraping, or loud snapping can indicate worn rollers, loose hardware, a failing torsion spring, or a track problem.
