Size selection is part math and part judgment. If you understand a couple of practical rules, it becomes much easier.

Start with what you are in fact storing

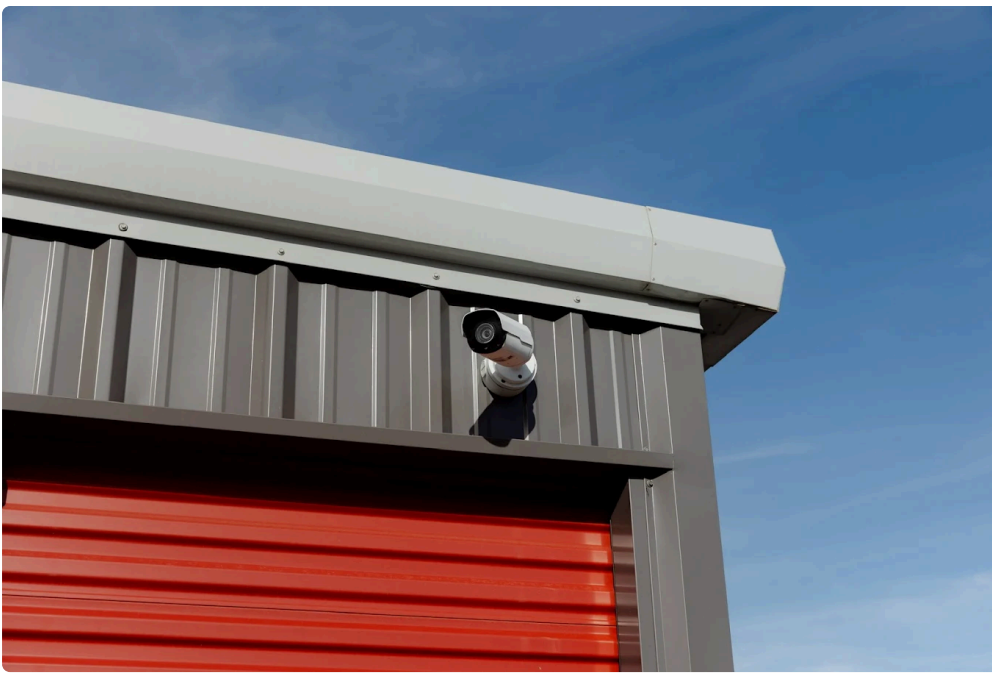
