- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.37-- 0.45
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00

Different skins have different wear limits. Some skins can not be obtained in Factory New condition, meaning the top-tier float values are exceptionally uncommon and command huge rates on the Steam Community Market.

## Why Do Players Keep Opening Cases?

With such daunting odds, why is the case-opening economy worth billions of dollars? The psychology behind CS: GO case odds relies heavily on cognitive biases.
