These cases are typically dismissed because of their low price tags, however they still consist of a handful of desirable skins that periodically command a premium.

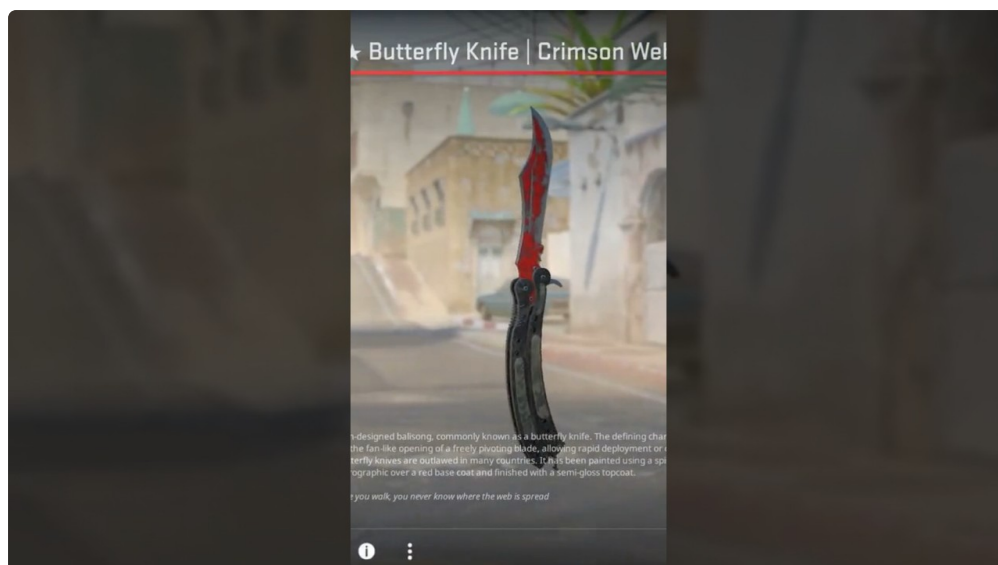
