- **Avoid "chasing" losses.** The RNG does not make up for previous "bad" openings; continuing to open cases in hopes of recouping losses typically results in further expenditure.

Legal and Safety Considerations

Age Restrictions

In most jurisdictions, CS2 case opening is thought about a loot-box mechanic and may undergo regional regulations regarding in-game purchases. Players must be of legal age to buy keys or cases in their nation.

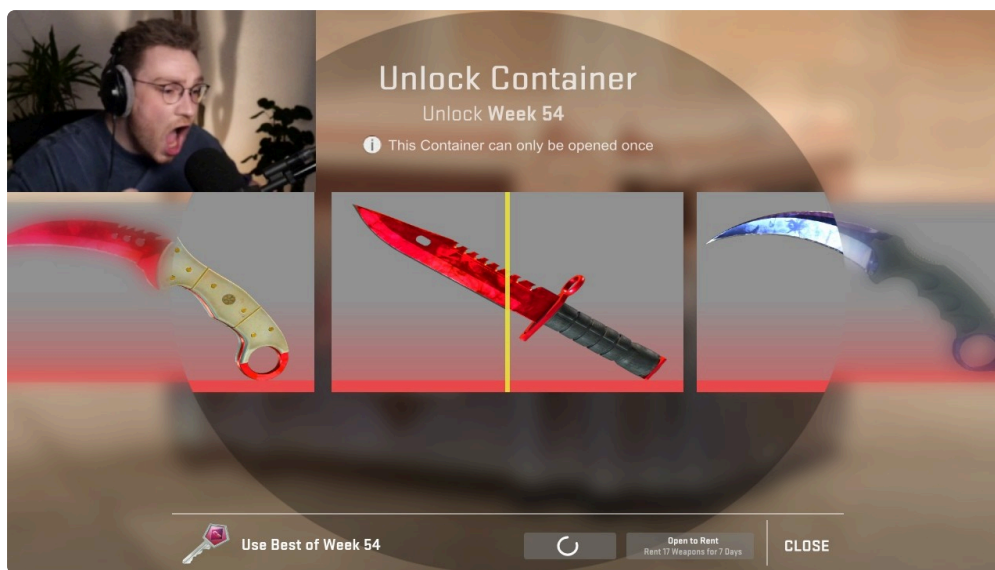

Is it possible to go "earnings neutral" by opening cases?Most players do not accomplish a net profit.
