The Anatomy of a CS2 Skin

1. Wear Ratings (Float Value)

Every skin is appointed a float value varying from **0.00 to 1.00**, which identifies its physical wear and tear. Rather than deteriorating through use, a skin's float is long-term upon creation.

Condition Float Range Visual Description **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Beautiful, minimal to no scratches.

Minimal Wear (MW) 0.07-- 0.15 Minor blemishes or small scratches. **Field-Tested (FEET)** 0.15-- 0.38 Visible wear, scratches, and fading. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.44 Considerable wear; paint is visibly broken. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.44-- 1.00 Heavily worn, rusted, or hardly identifiable.

Keep in mind: Some skins are "capped," indicating they can not exist in certain conditions (e.g., a skin might just generate approximately Minimal Wear).

2. StatTrak™ Technology

Skins with the StatTrak™ prefix feature a small, radiant LED counter connected <https://cs2skin.com/> to the weapon body. This counter tracks the exact number of kills the owner has secured with that particular weapon.

When equipped by another gamer, it momentarily shows an "mistake" up until gone back to the owner. StatTrak skins normally command a higher price on the marketplace.

3. Souvenir Packages

During Valve-sponsored Major competitions, viewers enjoying via Steam or partnered streaming platforms can drop Souvenir Packages. Weapons inside these bundles feature gold stickers honoring the match, the groups, and the MVP of the round, making them highly collectible.

Rarity Tiers and Drop Rates

Skins are categorized into distinct rarity tiers, which determine how regularly they appear in weapon cases. The rarity color codes are universally acknowledged in the gaming neighborhood:

- **Consumer Grade (White):** Common, basic weapon surfaces.
- **Industrial Grade (Light Blue):** Slightly exceptional to customer grade.
- **Mil-Spec (Dark Blue):** Standard low-tier items found in cases.
- **Limited (Purple):** Mid-tier products; frequently used in trade-ups.
- **Categorized (Pink):** Highly in-demand, striking styles.
- **Covert (Red):** The highest basic weapon tier; exceptionally unusual.
- **Rare Special Item (Gold):** Knives and Gloves. The holy grail of unboxing.

- **Trade-Up Contracts:** Players can trade 10 skins of one rarity tier for a single skin of the next higher tier, providing a method to recycle unwanted items.

Factors Driving Skin Prices:

3. **The "Trade-Up" Factor:** If a Covert skin can just be gotten by trading up particular categorized products, the active ingredients for that trade-up will increase in value.
4. **Aesthetics and Trends:** Clean, minimalist styles (like the *M4A4|Asiimov* or *AK-47|Redline*) or lively, neon patterns often retain long-lasting popularity.
