Phase 3: Managing Background Applications and Overlays

Advanced Solutions for Persistent Crashes

1. Changing Launch Options

Release options enable players to require the game to begin under particular parameters, which can bypass initialization bugs.

- Open Steam Library > > Right-click CS: GO > > Properties > General.
- In the **Launch Options** field, attempt adding:
 - -autoconfig (Resets video and efficiency settings to default)
 - -nod3d9ex (Disables an older DirectX extension that in some cases triggers conflicts)
 - -threads [number] (Forces the game to utilize a specific number of CPU cores)

2. Monitoring Hardware Temperatures and Overclocks

Pressing hardware beyond factory limitations via overclocking (CPU, GPU, or RAM) can lead to instability in demanding source-engine video games.

- Usage tracking software like HWMonitor or MSI Afterburner to inspect temperatures while playing.
- If temperatures go beyond 85 ° C, clear out dust filters and make sure appropriate air flow.
- Momentarily revert any factory overclocks or XMP profiles to test if system stability enhances.

3. Re-installing Visual C++ and DirectX

Numerous game crashes occur because the Windows os lacks the required runtime libraries required to perform video game scripts.

- Navigate to the video game's setup folder: Steam \ steamapps \ typical \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive \ _CommonRedist
- Run the installers situated inside the vcredist and DirectX folders to repair or upgrade necessary system files.
