Case Opening	Imitates the in-game case opening experience with custom-made odds and possibly greater return rates than official Valve cases. Simply luck-based; odds are determined by the platform.	
Coinflip	A 1v1 video game where two gamers bet skins of equal worth on a virtual coin toss. Winner takes all (minus a website commission). 50/50 odds, based on a platform rake (fee).	
Jackpot	Numerous gamers contribute skins to a typical pool. The greater the worth contributed, the higher the possibility of winning the entire pot. Probability-based based upon relative skin value.
