

The idea behind permanent holiday lights

These get installed one time and stay put. That single sentence is most of the appeal. What is up there is a slim LED track color matched to the house, which is why the house does not look decorated in July.

More than one holiday

Most people start with Christmas. Then they find the rest of the calendar. Orange for Halloween. Red, white and blue in July. School colors on a Friday night. Pink for a birthday. Green in March. And on the two hundred ordinary nights a year, it goes back to plain warm white, which is the setting that gets the most hours by a wide margin.

How the work gets done

It starts with a free look at your house. A design gets drawn for your roofline, based on what the building already gives you to work with. The install is handled by the crew, not handed to you as a kit. After that, you have an app and a house that lights up.

What it looks like with the lights off

The reasonable worry is holiday hardware on the front of the home in the summer. Because it is color matched and runs tight to the edge, most people have to be told where it is.

The fit

The people happiest with permanent holiday lights are already decorating every December. Anyone who has stopped enjoying the climb has an obvious reason to look at it. And it fits people who wanted the house lit at night anyway, regardless of the season.

Timing

Everything has to be finished before the night you want it running. That sounds obvious right up until the first week of December. Between the consultation, the plan and the crew's day, there is a real sequence. The upside is that you only do this once. After the first install, December is a phone tap instead of a weekend. What surprises new owners is how rarely they open the app after a while. You set the holiday schedule once and it handles itself. The lights come on at dusk and go off when you told them to, in whatever colors you picked, with nobody flipping a switch.

If you would rather have traditional lights

Not everyone wants a permanent system, which is fair. They also do seasonal Christmas light installation, with takedown and off season storage included in how they work. What is permanent outdoor lighting?

Permanent outdoor lighting is a fixed LED system installed along a building's roofline, eaves and architectural lines and left in place all year. The LEDs sit in a track that is color matched to the trim, and the system is controlled from a smartphone app. It replaces the seasonal strands that go up and come down each year.

Are the lights noticeable during the day?

The track is color matched to the trim or fascia and mounted tight along the edge of the roofline, so it is designed to stay discreet in daylight and read as part of the house rather than as decoration.

Does EverCrest Lighting install Christmas lights?

Yes. EverCrest Lighting installs Christmas and holiday lighting, and also installs permanent LED systems that handle holiday colors from an app. On traditional holiday lighting, EverCrest Lighting handles takedown at the end of the season and off season storage.
