

What to Do During a Plumbing Emergency in Murrieta The first sixty seconds of a plumbing emergency matter more than almost any other part of the response. Locating and shutting off the main water valve stops the situation from getting worse while help is on the way, and every Murrieta homeowner should know where that valve sits well before an emergency actually happens, not while water is already spreading across the floor. For a burst pipe or major leak, shutting off the main supply comes first, followed by cutting power to any electrical systems in the affected area if water is anywhere near outlets or fixtures. Electrical and water damage together create a genuinely dangerous situation, and safety takes priority over saving belongings in that first critical window.

A sewage backup calls for a different response. Avoid using any drains or toilets in the house until a plumber near me has assessed the situation, since continuing to run water can push the backup further into the home. Keeping people and pets away from the affected area limits exposure to contaminated water until professional cleanup and repair can begin. Gas smell paired with a [commercial plumber near me](#) plumbing issue, most often near a water heater, is the one scenario where calling the gas company or 911 takes priority over calling a plumber. Evacuate the area first, and only call for plumbing repair once the gas utility has confirmed it is safe to proceed.
