Sizing Your Mini Split: The BTU Calculator and Mini Split Sizing Chart 110V

Rule of thumb sizing ranges often suggest:

Room Size (sq ft)	Recommended BTU Range

- 110V mini splits require a dedicated 15 Amp circuit, separate from general household circuits. Confirm that your breaker panel can accommodate this; double-check breaker size and the wiring gauge in your home.
- A pigtail plug cable rated for at least 15A with three wires — hot (power), neutral, and ground — is essential. Grounding is not optional for safety and warranty compliance.

Proper wiring ensures smooth operation and safety. If you're uncertain about panel capacity or breakers, consult a licensed electrician before purchasing.

Plug and Play? Not Always.

Some manufacturers claim their mini splits are "plug and play." But I'm skeptical until I see the electrical details. A true plug-and-play 110V mini split system will come with a:

- **Pre-charged Quick Connect line set** — This lets DIYers avoid refrigerant handling, a serious hurdle usually requiring professional certification.
- Pre-wired pigtail plug cable rated for proper amperage, ready to connect to the dedicated circuit
