- **Effect Fractures:** Starbursts, bullseyes, or localized spider-web fractures triggered by flying debris or unintentional crashes.
- **Shattered Glass:** Complete structural failure where the glass get into tiny pieces (tempered glass) or large fragments (annealed glass).
- **Foggy Double-Paned Glass:** Indicates that the seal in between the two panes has stopped working, allowing moisture and condensation to get trapped inside.

remain consistent. 1. **Security First** Broken glass is inherently dangerous. Anybody managing the repair needs to use durable work gloves, protective eyeglasses, and closed-toe shoes. If the glass is entirely shattered, setting a tarpaulin or heavy plastic sheeting around the work

- **from the frame. Clearing Residue:** Scrape away old silicone, putty,

or double-sided glazing tape. Wipe the rabbet(the recess where the glass sits) tidy so the new glass will sit flush. 4. **Determining and Installing the Replacement Glass** Accurate measurements are important.

- **Measure the height, width, and thickness of the glass opening. Apply a fresh bead of silicone sealant or new**
- **glazing tape to the frame. Thoroughly set the new piece of glass into the opening, pushing carefully to develop a tight seal. Reinstall the stops, beads, or cut to secure the glass in place.**
