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Locating Garage Door Repair Near Me in Reseda

When a door will not close, inspect the area around the safety sensors without touching the wiring. The safety sensors, also called photo-eye sensors, must face each other and remain free of dirt, storage items, and accidental obstruction. Flashing lights or repeated reversal can indicate sensor alignment or wiring problems.

Garage door tracks also deserve attention. A bent garage door track, loose mounting bracket, or debris in the track can cause binding and uneven movement. Do not force the door or continue operating it if it is crooked, sagging, or making loud grinding sounds. A door that has come off its tracks can fall and cause serious injury or property damage. Call for professional service instead.

Warning Signs You Need Garage Door Spring Replacement

A broken garage door spring is one of the leading reasons a door suddenly becomes hard to lift or will not rise. Signs can include a visible gap in a coil, a loose spring, a loud snap noticed before the failure, cables hanging loose, or an opener that runs while the door remains on the ground. If you disconnect the opener using the emergency release and the door is challenging to lift manually, the spring system may stop balancing the door.

Most residential systems use either a torsion spring mounted above the door or extension springs positioned along the horizontal tracks. A torsion spring generally provides regulated movement through a shaft, while an extension spring stretches as the door moves. Both systems can be dangerous to service or change without the correct tools and training.

Ask whether the quote includes both springs when the system uses a pair, new lift cables if needed, adjustment, testing, disposal, and a parts warranty. Instruct children and guests not to play beneath the door or operate it as a toy. Keep children and pets away from the garage door while it is moving, and do not enter or exit beneath a door that is only partially open.
