The biggest error in tough ground is trying to require the pole directly down with all your weight. That usually flexes the pole, glances off a rock, or drives also boldly near the pipe leaving your house. Better results originated from constant stress, shallow spacing between test openings, and taking notice of what the pole tells your hands.
