- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00

Some skins look extraordinary even at higher wear worths, while others look greatly damaged. Understanding how float worths effect rate is crucial if you mean to trade or offer your unboxed items.

3. Consider Buying Directly
