How system age determines the true cost of your next heat pump

A system that is 10 years old may be worth repairing; a system that is 17 years old almost never is, regardless of what the current repair quote says. The reason is simple: new heat pump systems are 15 to 20 percent more efficient than 15-year-old units, which means your monthly energy costs will drop significantly after replacement. Over a five-year span, that efficiency gain often offsets the entire \$4,000 to \$12,000 upfront cost of a new installation. Why repair costs multiply as equipment ages beyond design life

Older heat pumps fail in stages. The first repair might be a capacitor replacement at \$150 to \$400. The next year brings a refrigerant recharge for \$300 to \$600. Then the compressor begins to struggle, and suddenly you are facing a \$1,500 to \$4,000 repair that approaches 40 percent of the cost of replacement.
