Active Drop Pool	Cases presently dropping to players actively using official and neighborhood servers.	Common (Weekly drops)	Kilowatt Case, Recoil Case, Gallery Case
Uncommon Drop Pool	Stopped cases that no longer drop routinely as end-of-match benefits.	Extremely Rare (approx. <<1% opportunity)	CS: GO Weapon Case, Chroma Case, Gamma Case

2. Anatomy of a Case Opening: What are the Odds?

Opening a CS2 case requires two things: the case itself and a matching **Key** (purchased in-game for £ 2.50 GBP). When combined, the case spins through a randomized sequence before landing on a weapon finish.



Valve does not officially release precise percentages for every [CSGO Case Opening](#) single single drop, but substantial community information mining and massive sample openings have offered a clear statistical image of case chances.

Estimated CS2 Case Probabilities

- **Mil-Station (Blue):** ~ 79.92%
- **Restricted (Purple):** ~ 15.98%
- **Classified (Pink):** ~ 3.2%
- **Covert (Red):** ~ 0.64%
- **Special Item/ Rare (Gold/ Knives & & Gloves):** ~ 0.26%

* Note: There is an additional ~ 10% opportunity that any weapon skin dropped will include **StatTrak™**, which tracks confirmed eliminates with that particular weapon. *
