1. The AWP|Dragon Lore

Perhaps the most popular skin in the video game, the Dragon Lore features a mythical dragon breathing fire across the body of the sniper rifle. Initially dropped exclusively on particular maps like Cobblestone throughout major competitions, these souvenir bundles are now extremely uncommon. A Factory New Souvenir Dragon Lore signed by superstar gamer Skadoodle famously offered for over £ 60,000 years back, and prices have only escalated because.

2. The AK-47|Case Hardened (Pattern 661 "Blue Gem")

While a basic Case Hardened AK-47 is reasonably budget-friendly, the top-tier pattern indices-- specifically Pattern 661-- cover nearly the whole leading receiver of the gun in a pristine, reflective blue. Since the odds of unpacking this specific pattern with a good float value are astronomically low, these products have actually commanded personal deals going beyond 6 figures.

3. StatTrak™ M4A4|Groan

The Howl is distinct since it holds historic significance. Valve removed the original artwork due to a copyright violation claim, making the skin "Contraband." Valve updated the style and stopped it from dropping totally. Anyone holding a Howl at that time kept it, producing a completely capped supply.

Elements Influencing the Market
