- **Prize:** Multiple players pool their skins into a single pot. The higher the worth of a player's skins, the greater their statistical opportunity of winning the whole pot.
- **Esports Betting:** Wagering on professional CS2 matches (such as BLAST, ESL Pro League, and Majors) utilizing skins, crypto, or cash.

3. Deposit and Withdrawal Methods
