Well-Worn (WW)	0.38-- 0.44	Substantial wear; paint is noticeably chipped.
Battle-Scarred (BS)	0.44-- 1.00	Heavily used, rusted, or hardly identifiable.

Note: Some skins are "capped," implying they can not exist in certain conditions (e.g., a skin may only generate approximately Minimal Wear).

2. StatTrak™ Technology

Skins with the StatTrak™ prefix function a small, radiant LED counter connected to the weapon body. This counter tracks the specific number of kills the owner has protected with that specific weapon. When geared up

by another player, it briefly shows an "error" until returned to the owner. StatTrak skins typically command a greater rate on the marketplace.

3. Keepsake Packages

Throughout Valve-sponsored Major competitions, audiences watching by means of Steam or partnered streaming platforms can drop Souvenir Packages. Weapons inside these packages feature gold stickers commemorating the match, the teams, and the MVP of the round, making them extremely collectible.

Rarity Tiers and Drop Rates

Skins are categorized into unique rarity tiers, which determine how regularly they appear in weapon cases. The rarity color codes are widely recognized in the video gaming neighborhood:

- **Consumer Grade (White):** Common, basic weapon surfaces.
- **Industrial Grade (Light Blue):** Slightly superior to consumer grade.
- **Mil-Spec (Dark Blue):** Standard low-tier products found in cases.
- **Limited (Purple):** Mid-tier products; frequently utilized in trade-ups.
- **Categorized (Pink):** Highly sought-after, striking designs.
- **Covert (Red):** The greatest basic weapon tier; extremely uncommon.
- **Rare Special Item (Gold):** Knives and Gloves. The holy grail of unboxing.
