CoinFlip is a direct player-vs-player (PvP) video game mode. 2 players wager skins of approximately equal financial worth. A virtual coin is turned, and the winner takes the whole pot, minus a little commission (house edge) taken by the site.

4. Jackpot

In a Jackpot video game, multiple gamers toss skins into a central [Home page](#) pot. Each skin adds to the gamer's overall portion opportunity of winning the whole pot (based upon the dollar worth of their contribution). A virtual spinner selects a winning ticket, and one lucky player takes home all the deposited skins.
