Kinds of CS: GO Betting Markets

- **Outright/ Tournament Winner:** Wagering on which team will lift the prize at the end of a significant tournament like an IEM or a BLAST Premier occasion.
- **Live (In-Play) Betting:** Placing bets while the match is actively taking place, with odds varying in real-time based upon the current economy, round score, and momentum.

Comparing Popular CS: GO Betting Platforms

Picking the best platform depends totally on user preferences-- whether they prefer wagering with real money, cryptocurrency, or virtual skins. Below is a comparison of the typical functions discovered across the industry.
