- **DeepSearch:** Focuses on document-level AI search, optimized for large databases, academic corpora, or enterprise knowledge bases.
- **Big Brain:** Offers AI-powered memory and knowledge augmentation, useful for study groups or researchers needing persistent AI context.

Neither DeepSearch nor Big Brain currently advertises student discounts either, but their pricing models can sometimes be more transparent with tiered plans and documented rate limits. Unlike Grok's bundled AI assistant approach, these tools are more specialized, and their pricing tends to reflect their focused capabilities.

Things Worth Not Searching For (Because They Don't Exist)
