3. CoinFlip

CoinFlip is a direct player-vs-player (PvP) game mode. 2 players wager skins of approximately equal monetary value. A virtual coin is flipped, and the winner takes the entire pot, minus a small commission (home edge) taken by the site.

4. Jackpot

In a Jackpot video game, several players throw skins into a central pot. Each skin contributes to the gamer's total portion opportunity of winning the whole pot (based on the dollar worth of their contribution). A virtual spinner selects a winning ticket, and one lucky player takes home all the deposited skins.
