3. **StatTrak™ Technology:** Weapons with this feature track the variety of verified kills a player makes with that specific product, typically marked by a small digital counter on the weapon.
4. **Pattern Templates:** Some skins include vibrant patterns. Depending upon the "paint seed," different parts of the texture appear on the weapon, which can drastically change its desirability.

Understanding Wear Conditions and Float Values

When players get a skin, its condition is assigned among five main wear tiers. The physical look changes substantially throughout these categories, frequently exposing scratches, fading colors, or tarnished metal.

Use Tier Drift Value Range Visual Description **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Beautiful condition with minimal to no noticeable wear. Frequently the most costly variation of a skin. **Very Little Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Small acnes or small scratches, generally just visible upon close inspection. **Field-Tested (FEET)** 0.15-- 0.38 Moderate wear. Scratches and paint chipping become plainly visible on the body and barrel. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Substantial wear. Major parts of the paint are faded, and heavy scratches are prominent. **Battle-Scarred (BS)**

0.45-- 1.00 Incredibly worn. The weapon typically looks heavily rusted, dirty, or nearly completely stripped of paint. (Note: Some skins look distinctively cool in this condition, making the nickname "Blackimov").
