- **Appeal:** Simple rules and familiar mechanics attract casual and veteran bettors alike.

4. Jackpot/ Pot Games

- **How it works:** Multiple players deposit skins into a collective pot. Each skin contributes tickets based upon its dollar value. A random draw chooses a winner, where a greater overall contribution yields a higher statistical chance of winning the whole pot.
- **Appeal:** The supreme "high-roller" video game mode, where single fortunate winners can leave with thousands of dollars in uncommon digital products.

Traditional Casino Games vs. CSGO-Themed Games

The Economics of Skin Trading and Withdrawal
