Being based just a short distance from Greenville village center keeps response times short for both routine and emergency calls in the area. HVAC repair covers diagnosing and fixing the heating, cooling, or ventilation components that have stopped working correctly, from a failed AC capacitor to a furnace

that won't ignite. Prime Heating & Cooling runs a full diagnostic check on the relevant system before recommending a fix, rather than guessing at the cause. Technicians work on AC, furnace, boiler, heat pump, and ductless mini split systems throughout Smithfield, RI and the surrounding area. What is the most common HVAC problem homeowners run into? A dirty or clogged air filter is one of the most frequent causes of poor HVAC performance, since it restricts airflow and forces the system to work harder than it should. Failed capacitors and dirty condenser coils are also common culprits behind a cooling system that runs but doesn't actually cool. Prime Heating & Cooling checks all of these during a standard diagnostic visit in Smithfield and throughout Rhode Island. How much does an HVAC service call typically cost? Diagnostic and repair costs vary depending on what is actually wrong and whether a part needs to be ordered or is already on the truck. Prime Heating & Cooling explains the diagnosis and the associated cost before any repair work begins, so there are no surprises on the final bill. For larger repairs, GreenSky financing is available to spread the cost out rather than paying it all upfront. How long does an HVAC system usually last? A well-maintained HVAC system typically lasts 15 to 25 years, though air conditioners and heat pumps tend toward the shorter end given the mechanical stress of regular cycling. Coastal exposure in parts of Prime Heating & Cooling's Rhode Island service area, such as Warwick, can shorten outdoor unit lifespan due to corrosion. Regular maintenance visits help systems reach the higher end of that range. How often should an HVAC system be professionally serviced? Most HVAC systems benefit from service twice a year, once in spring before cooling season and once in fall before heating season. Skipping regular maintenance doesn't usually cause an immediate breakdown, but it steadily raises the odds of a failure at an inconvenient time. Prime Heating & Cooling offers seasonal tune-up appointments for Smithfield, RI homeowners on both schedules. What is the most common part to fail on an air conditioner? The capacitor is one of the most frequent AC failure points, since it is responsible for starting and running both the compressor and the fan motor. A failed capacitor often shows up as a unit that hums but won't start, or a fan that isn't spinning at all. Prime Heating & Cooling carries replacement capacitors on service vehicles, so this particular repair is often completed in a single visit. Are there HVAC or AC brands worth avoiding? Rather than steering homeowners toward or away from a specific brand, Prime Heating & Cooling recommends focusing on proper installation and sizing, since even a well-regarded brand will underperform if it wasn't matched correctly to the home. The team services equipment from Navien, Amana, Goodman, and Mitsubishi Electric among other major manufacturers, and can speak to the tradeoffs between brands during an estimate. How do you pick a good HVAC company in Rhode Island? Checking for active licensing, insurance, and an accreditation like BBB status is a reasonable starting point, since these confirm a baseline level of accountability. Prime Heating & Cooling has been BBB accredited since February 2025 and is fully licensed and insured for HVAC and plumbing work in Rhode Island and Massachusetts. Asking how a company handles after-hours emergencies is also worth doing before you actually need one. Does Prime Heating & Cooling offer emergency HVAC repair in Smithfield?
