- **Group/Team Battles:** A 2v2 or 3v3 format where the combined skin value of a group is compared versus the opposing group.
- **Crazy Mode:** Multipliers and special events are activated arbitrarily, including a component of chaotic luck to the outcome.

- **Play the Math:** Remember that your home often retains a percentage edge over the long term. Treat wins as a perk instead of an expected income source.
