How Transactions Work: Steam API and P2P Trading

In the past, CS2 gambling websites utilized bots that directly traded with players through Steam accounts. However, Valve has broken down on automated trading bots throughout the years by executing trade lock durations (items traded can not be re-traded for 7 days) and upgrading API security.



Today, a lot of platforms utilize **Peer-to-Peer (P2P) systems**.

1. When a player wishes to deposit, the site pairs them with another player seeking to squander.
2. The transferring gamer sends out the skin straight to the purchaser via a secure Steam trade link.
3. The site credits the depositor's account balance once the trade is confirmed.

This technique assists platforms circumvent direct participation in dealing with Valve's inventory items while keeping the virtual economy streaming.

Threats Associated with CS2 Gambling

- **Usage Two-Factor Authentication (2FA):** Secure your Steam Guard mobile authenticator and e-mail accounts carefully.
