- **Jackpot:** Multiple gamers pool their skins into a single pot. The greater the value of a player's skins, the higher their analytical possibility of winning the entire pot.
- **Esports Betting:** Wagering on expert CS2 matches (such as BLAST, ESL Pro League, and Majors) using skins, crypto, or money.
