- **Think About Trading Instead of Opening**-- If you're after a particular skin, purchasing it straight from the market can be more affordable than buying secrets and hoping for a lucky drop.
- **Stay Informed About Market Trends**-- Prices for rare skins can skyrocket after a case is retired. Watching on market cycles can assist you time purchases.
