Beyond the base rarity, a number of additional characteristics press a skin into the "rare" category:

1. **Float Value**-- The lower the float (0.0-- 1.0), the cleaner the finish. Minimal wear (Factory New or Minimal Wear) often commands a premium.
2. **Pattern/StatTrak™**-- StatTrak™ skins (those that track eliminates) are normally scarcer than their vanilla equivalents.
3. **Case or Collection Age**-- Skins from stopped cases (e.g., *The Arms Deal Case*) end up being increasingly limited as the case stops dropping.
4. **Occasion or Esports Origin**-- Limited-time competition Souvenirs or items connected to specific majors (e.g., *Cobblestone Souvenir*) rarely reappear.
5. **Distinct Finishes**-- Special finishes such as *Fade*, *Case Hardened* (with a high blue gem pattern), or *Night Stripe* have an unique visual appeal that fuels demand.
