* The "Rare Item Drop Rate" represents the possibility that the RNG will award a "Rare" (Gold) product, which can be a knife, glove, or stat-trak variation of a high-tier skin. The precise probability for each specific skin within that tier is a separate, concealed calculation.

The table demonstrates that while many cases cost just a couple of dollars, the cs2skin.com probability of landing a high-value skin remains extremely low. Gamers must therefore view case opening as a form of entertainment instead of a trustworthy investment.
