

The very first time I aided a neighbor install a sprinkler system, we set aside one weekend. We finished on the 3rd, aching, sunburned, and a little humbled. 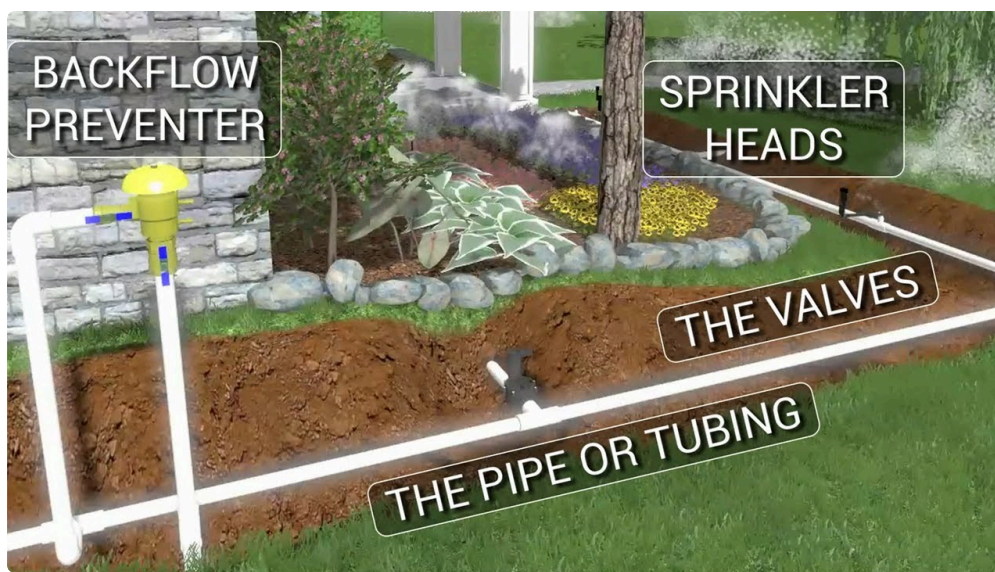
