- **Case Opening:** Simulates the in-game case-opening mechanic, typically with personalized chances and higher-tier skin swimming pools.
- **Prize:** Multiple players deposit skins into a single pot. The greater the worth of a player's deposit, the higher their statistical chance of winning the entire accumulated pot.
- **Esports Betting:** Wagering on professional CS2 matches (e.g., ESL Pro League, Majors) utilizing virtual balance or skins, forecasting match winners, map ratings, or particular in-game occasions.

Comparison of Deposit and Withdrawal Methods

- **Fraud Sites:** Fake reproductions of popular gambling sites (phishing sites) regularly emerge to take user login credentials and Steam inventories.

- **Never Ever Share Credentials:** Always log in strictly through the main Steam OpenID prompt. Never type your Steam password directly into a third-party pop-up window.
