- **Case Opening & Battles:** Users can open virtual cases on the site, often with better odds or custom rewards compared to main in-game cases. Case battles allow several players to open the very same cases all at once, with the gamer who opens the greatest total value winning all the items.
- **Prize:** Multiple players deposit skins into a main pot. A winner is drawn randomly, with the probability of winning proportional to the value of the skins transferred.
