Take-Profit Target	Set a desired profit amount; squander when reached.	Protects profits before a crash.
Auto-Cash-Out	Set an automatic cash-out multiplier (e.g., 1.5 ×).	Reduces emotional decision-making.

Tips for Responsible Play

- **Set a Budget**-- Decide in advance just how much you want to lose and never exceed it.
- **Use a Separate Account**-- Keep skin-gambling funds separate from your primary gaming account.
- **Avoid Chasing Losses**-- Accept that losing streaks happen; do not increase bets to recuperate.
- **Take Regular Breaks**-- Step away from the video game to keep viewpoint.
- **Know the Site's Reputation**-- Choose platforms with transparent provably-fair systems and positive user reviews.
