They flagged the paint and solvents as hazmat, estimated 12 gallons total, and offered two alternatives: the homeowner could drop the cans at the county event on Saturday morning totally free, or the company might deal with hazmat transport for a flat 120 dollars, which covered their fee and the facility intake. They also validated they would leave the freezer's refrigerant correctly and provided the accreditation of their home appliance recycler.

The distinction in professionalism was clear. The house owner chose to spend for hazmat handling to [junk removal companies](#) conserve time, accepted the firm rate, and scheduled for 9 a.m. Two team members showed up early, prepped doorframes with blankets, and had the garage clear by 10:45.
