Rarity Tiers

Skins are color-coded based upon how tough they are to get. This hierarchy dictates the standard value of an item within the community market.

Float Values and Wear Conditions

No 2 skins are totally identical thanks to the **Float Value** system. A float worth is a number between **0.00** and **1.00** that figures out the physical wear and tear on a weapon's texture.

- **Factory New (FN):** 0.00-- 0.07 (Pristine condition)
- **Minimal Wear (MW):** 0.07-- 0.15 (Minor scratches)
- **Field-Tested (FT):** 0.15-- 0.38 (Noticeable wear)
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45 (Significant wear)
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00 (Heavily damaged, often exposing surprise patterns)

Note: Some skins are "float-capped," suggesting they can not physically drop in Factory New condition, making lower-float versions exceptionally rare and costly.

The Anatomy of Value: Why Do Skins Cost A Lot?

While some skins cost mere cents, others have actually offered for hundreds of countless dollars. A combination of aspects determines why a digital item commands such high rates:

1. **Supply and Demand:** If a weapon case is discontinued (transferred to the "uncommon drop pool"), the supply of its contents dwindles while the gamer base grows, driving prices up.
2. **Float and Pattern Index:** Certain patterns (like Case Hardened "Blue Gems") or exceptionally low float values develop one-of-a-kind products that collectors contest.
3. **Pro Player Association:** When a professional esports player pulls off a famous clutch using a specific weapon surface, that skin frequently sees an instant spike in popularity and rate.
4. **Trade-Up Contracts:** Players can feed 10 skins of one rarity into a contract to get one skin of the next higher tier, permanently deleting the inputs and decreasing the general market supply.

Popular Weapon Families and Iconic Skins

Over a decade of updates has actually produced thousands of skins. Nevertheless, a couple of stand apart as cultural examples within the neighborhood.

Iconic Skins Worth Knowing:

- **AWP|Dragon Lore:** The holy grail of CS: GO trading. Originally dropping solely on Cobblestone maps, its golden dragon artwork makes it a valued ownership for high-tier collectors.
- **AK-47|Case Hardened:** Famous for its diverse blue and gold pattern percentages. A 100% blue leading variation can command astronomical sums.
- **M4A4|Howl:** The only skin classified as "Contraband." It was removed from official drops due to copyright infringement concerns surrounding its art work, making existing copies irreplaceable.
- **StatTrak™ Factory New Asiimov:** A sci-fi traditional including a tidy white, black, and orange color combination that remains a fan favorite across numerous weapons.

How Players Acquire Skins
